Olly Day visited school to perform his road safety show to Class 2 and Class 3 on Monday 3rd June. All children enjoyed.

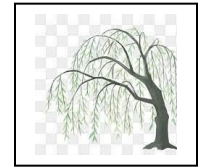


MAPLE CLASS
