WILLOW CLASS

In Literacy, Willow Class researched Benjamin Zephaniah and read several of his poems. This week, we have listened to Roald Dahl's top tips for performing poems and using this knowledge, have practised performing them.



We are now coming to the end of our unit in science having looked at flowering plants. We enjoyed investigating what happens to cress and cornflowers when placed in different temperatures, how temperature affected the transportation of water up the stem by putting red dye in the water and watching white chrysanthemums change colour.

In RE, we have found out about Allah, pilgrimage, the Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) and have created some artwork based on the differing names of Allah.

In our computing classes, we have learnt about hyperlinks and also added audio and animations to our slide shows on Microsoft PowerPoint.
