## MAPLE CLASS



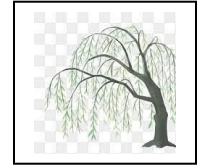

## WILLOW CLASS



KS2 were very fortunate last week to watch the amazing 'Lion King' at the Lyceum Theatre in London and thoroughly enjoyed the performance. It was so inspiring, we are now starting to learn some of the songs from the performance.

Having seen the exceptional masks at the performance, it has also inspired our art work where we are continuing to look at masks used by the Maya made out of papier-mâché. This week, we are starting to decorate these using paint.

# ASH CLASS



In science this term Class 3 are focusing on states of matter including soluble and insoluble materials, solutions and reversible and irreversible changes.

The class have tried to grow crystals from a salt solution. They added a spoonful of salt to warm water until the salt crystals were no longer able to dissolve. They then tied a piece of knotted cotton and suspended it in the solution to hopefully encourage crystals to grow. This will show that dissolving salt is a reversible change.
